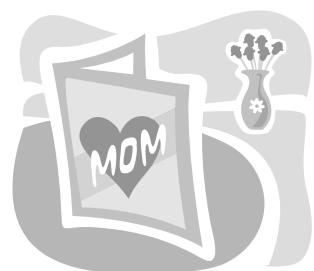
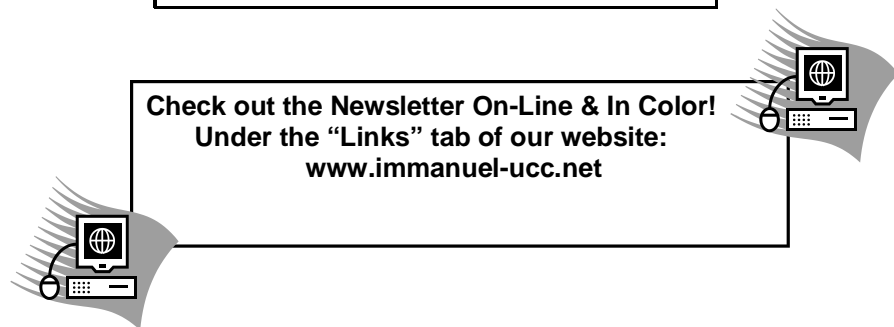

April 11, 2011

President Cris Meyer called the meeting to order with all Consistory members present as well as Rev. Schwartz. Youth representatives Chase Miller and Shae Blazier were also present. Rev. Schwartz opened the meeting with a prayer. One guest, Shay Meyer, was present.

Shay Meyer, Director of Christian Education, gave a report of the monthly activities and an update on Leaps and Bounds.

Rev. Schwartz informed the Consistory that May 15th at 4:00 pm will be his Installation Service with Rev. Douglas Anders preaching. The offering collected during the service will be given to CUE. Patsye Roesler will be in charge of planning the installation reception with the Church House Cookers preparing BBQ chickens.

After a discussion on the plans for the fall meeting of the Houston Association, Wade Bosse made a motion for Immanuel to host the Fall meeting on October 29th. Mark Wendt seconded the motion. Motion carried. Rev. Schwartz has been in contact with the pastors of St. John's in Rosenberg and Frieden's in Beasley about the possibilities of some joint ventures in the future.

Minutes: The minutes of the March 14, 2011 meeting were approved as amended. Clarence Thielemann, not Irvin Meyer, fixed the door in the Bar-B-Q area and the recess cans around the lights on the carport area. Bobby and Mary Zwahr donated the hardware, which was the Schlage Lockset, for the new front doors.

Treasurer's Report: The checking balance as of 3-31-11 was \$12,699.41. Wade Bosse reviewed the Treasure's report. The Memorial CD will be renewed. The treasurer's report was filed for audit.

Committee Reports:

Building and Grounds: A church grounds clean-up workday was held on March 26th with the help of the Confirmation class and their families. David Thielemann reported on Hausler's bid for \$2,741.16 which included removal of the old carpet covering the stairs, recarpeting the stairs, and replacing the entry area flooring. The Memorial Committee chose the color of the stair carpeting and entry way flooring replacement. The money will come out of the Memorial Fund. If additional money is needed to fix the stairs when the old carpet is removed, it will be taken from the Building Fund. Leaps and Bounds would like three planter boxes (about 2' X 6' each) by their side door entryway for the students to grow plants. The Consistory will search for someone to donate or build these planter boxes. Debbie Altimore volunteered to donate the dirt to fill them. Rita Evans volunteered to form a committee to beautify the flowerbeds around the front of the church and fellowship hall. She requested a budget of \$400. Mark Wendt made a motion to allocate \$400 from Building and Grounds to be used to plant the flowerbeds. Kelly Dunk seconded the motion. Motion passed. Cris Meyer had found some wireless fire alarms at Lowe's and will purchase them for installation in the fellowship hall. Mark Evans asked for help to water the newly planted tree to keep it alive. Kim Fredrickson offered to water the tree on Tuesdays and Thursdays until the end of the Leaps and Bounds school year. The parking lot will be painted with two additional handicapped parking spots on either side of the bridge sometimes this month.

Worship/Evangelism: The choir, along with St. Paul's choir members, will be hosting an Easter Cantata on May 1st as the church service. St. Paul's is looking into buying an organ/piano combination and wondered if Immanuel was interested in one. A committee of Larry Dunlap, Dolores Bain, and Andrew Moses was set up to check into the costs of the combo organ/piano.

Christian Education: Members will meet on April 14th to stuff eggs for the Easter Egg Hunt.

Mission & Outreach: Plans are underway for a mission trip to South Texas this summer with participants staying on this side of the border to work.

Brotherhood: The Brotherhood hosted their steak dinner and will meet on April 14th at the church.

Old Business:

With the designation of Open Market funds going toward upgrading the electrical wiring in the church, it was suggested that an electrical study be done by a master electrician to identify possible needs to improve the electrical wiring. After the findings of the study, the job would be open for bids. Mark Wendt made a motion that James Urbish be hired to thoroughly inspect the sanctuary if the electrical study fee is within the \$1,500 to \$2,000 range. Mark Evans seconded the motion. Motion carried. It was suggested that Clarence Thielemann and Irvin Meyer meet with Mr. Urbish to go over the inspection.

At the March meeting, Bruce Oberhoff addressed the Consistory with concerns on the UCC's promotion of open and affirming in its presentations at Slumber Falls Camp. The Consistory would like to form a committee to look into OCWM spending to clarify where our money goes when we contribute to it. This will help on the next year's budgeting process.

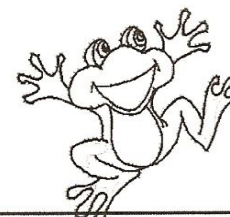
