We're glad to report to the congregation that we have hired an interim minister to fill in while the search committee continues its search for a permanent senior minister. Reverend John Howard Reed ("Howard") will officially assume his duties on Monday, October 11. His first Sunday in the pulpit will be October 17. Rev. Reed is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church and has served Churches in Texas, Ohio, and spent four years in Surrey, England, serving two congregations of the United Reformed Church. He is a graduate of the University of Texas, Austin and received his seminary training at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. He is widely traveled and has led mission work trips to Mexico, Honduras, Southeast Texas and the Mississippi coast.

Rev. Reed, in his ministerial profile writes: "Throughout my ministry I have tried to build up the church spiritually, physically, numerically, and emotionally. I want the church to be strong and in the pursuit of strength to rely upon the strength of our Lord, who became vulnerable in order that the world might have life and have it abundantly. I have striven to proclaim boldly the good news I find in the Bible's rendering of God's mighty acts, particularly the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. I sincerely desire to grow in service."

Additionally, he states that one of the greatest needs of the church is to focus on children both inside and beyond the church. In his words, "I have always tried to sharpen the focus on children's ministries and will continue."

Rev. Reed lives in Houston, Texas with his wife, Lorraine, a family nurse practitioner at Texas Children's hospital. The Reed's have a daughter, Clara, a junior in college. A son, Ansel, died in 2006 at age 20 from complications of a genetic immune deficiency.

Rev. Reed brings a wealth of professional and personal experience to enhance his ministry with us. Be sure to meet and welcome him to Immanuel!

The Open Market Place committee held a meeting on Thursday September 16, 2010. They discussed several items. The church has received a generous gift of a Husqvarna Zero Turn Mower. This mower has a Briggs & Stratton engine with a 19.5 HP and it is a 46 inch cutting width. The committee has decided that this mower will be on a separate raffle ticket. We will also include a \$250.00 gift certificate to Lowes on this ticket. We will only sell 300 tickets and they can be purchased for \$10.00 a ticket or 3 tickets for \$25.00. The drawing for this mower will be held at Open Market Place. This is a separate raffle from the other raffle. We will still be selling our regular raffle tickets. Meal tickets and raffle tickets will be available in the church office from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM Monday thru Friday. We will also be selling them in front of the church on Sunday mornings. You will be able to purchase them or pick them up to take out and help sell to your friends and family. We will start giving out our signs again the first Sunday in October and ask that you display them in your yard. We will have you once again return them to the Church after Market Place where they can be cleaned and put up for next year. This worked very well last year. Amegy Bank has offered to sell tickets once again and display our basket raffle. Cindy said that we can start bringing baskets to Amegy Bank after October 1<sup>st</sup>. You can take them there or drop them off at the Church office and we will get them to the bank. ### CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

The Consistory met on Monday, September 13 with 12 members present. Absent were Mark Evans and Clint Mikeska. Mark Evans has been in Arkansas with his sick mother. Pastor Banda and Garrett Arrington were also present. Also, Kari Weidemann gave an update of the Mother's Day Out and presented a check from the school for \$1,500.

The treasurer reported the bank balance as of 8-31-10 was \$4,798.20. total indebtedness of the parking lot including \$40,000 in interest free loans from church members is \$44,560.18. Pastor Banda went over a list of "need to know" details for the upcoming months and provided a list of shut-ins for the interim minister.

Reports by various committees included: top panes of stained glass windows need to be repaired, security lights need to fixed and air conditioner in Senior Citizen Room needs to be repaired (Property); Worship committee has lined up lay worship leaders, Kevin Marek (ministerial intern) & Rev. Don Kolkmeir to cover upcoming services, possible organist is being contacted and a hot dog/ice cream social with program by Mitchell Tillman was successful; Cemetery Committee has improved the road through the cemetery with gravel from the parking lot project; Memorial Committee has designated October 17<sup>th</sup> as Homecoming Sunday with Church House Cookers preparing the barbeque; Christian Education reported a very successful Rally Day; Sunday School, Youth Club & Confirmation have started; Mission & Outreach will have a garage sale on Saturday, September 18 with help needed setting up on Friday and during the sale on Saturday; The Interim Search Committee presented Rev. John Howard Reed as an interim minister to the Consistory; the Consistory approved their recommendation; the Brotherhood prepared hot dogs for the ice cream social and will meet at Shulze's Barbeque on August 16.

In Old Business, the annual financial review was done by Kelly Dunk and Gayle Horak on August 12. Financial records and bank statements are in order.

In New Business the Consistory approved paying non-ordained ministers \$75 for their services until the interim arrives. Pastor Banda's final Sunday was Sept. 12 and will us the final two weeks of August as vacation. His pension will be paid through September. A Gravely mower donated to the church for Open Marketplace will be raffled separately. A report from Rally Day showed that 176 chickens were cooked with \$642 made from the sale of chickens and \$575.00 received from meal donations. The net profit amounted to \$247.58

One building use request was approved. In correspondence, thank-you letters were received from Shay Meyer, Slumber Falls for a \$1,000 donation, Eden Seminary for \$3,740 through the year, and Back Bay Mission. The Houston Association sent a letter encouraging congregations to budget \$8 per member as their contribution in 2011.

In Wider Mission, Consistory approved giving \$1,000 to OCWM, \$500 to Eden Seminary and \$500 to Eden Home for the aged. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. (Complete and officially approved minutes of this meeting will be available after the October Consistory meeting.)
